ALEXANDRA LEESE

Born in 1988 in Hong Kong, she moved to the UK at the age of 11. Graduated with BA honors in Fashion Photography from London College of Fashion, she attended her foundation year at Chelsea College of Art and Design.

She got the chance to work and collaborate with artists and brands such as Wing Shya, Yumi Carter, Marc Jacobs and Asai. Though her subjects may seem soft and discreet, they can quickly envelop the viewer; Alexandra Leese employs her work to explore her own identity and to reshape the female narrative as a woman herself. Alex' first zine Boys of Hong Kong focuses on the new generation of male Hongkongers; by means of these photos, she aims to free firstly and foremost her subjects from the western stereotypes involving Asian men. The pandemic, on the other hand, gave life to her most recent and successful project, Me + Mine. Shooting remotely via webcam, she illustrated 44 women all around the world, giving them the opportunity to express themselves through their body in a genuine way, in the attempt to dismantle the male gaze. "Because the body of a woman is so political, it can be exhausting how our bodies are used as ways to control and define us".
