

CLARA BRÖRMANN

Shapes and colours harmoniously grow together in Clara's paintings, finding balance as anthropomorphic geometry. In her works, the human body becomes the reference value, the starting point. At the same time, colour is the predominant material Clara works with, focusing on its materiality and its intrinsic features. She hardly use loud and bright colours, to avoid them pushing themselves too much into the foreground. Reflection, repetition, twisting and interrupting. Concentrating less on the psychological effect or connection of her paintings, Clara invites the viewer to conceive them as "pictorial structures", with colours as their "building material".

Born in 1982 in Duisburg, she currently lives and works in Berlin.
