Geng Xue's versatile artistic practice encompasses ceramics, sculpture, painting, and video. Her work has been showcased in prestigious exhibitions such as the Chinese Pavilion at the 2019 Venice Biennale, the 2018 Biennale of Sydney, a parallel exhibition at the 2017 Venice Biennale, and the Busan Biennale in 2014. Her art has graced renowned museums and institutions in China, the UK, the USA, France, Germany, Italy, Spain, Austria, Switzerland, Finland, the Netherlands, Japan, South Korea, Indonesia, Australia and South America.

Geng has participated in a range of international residency programs, collaborating with institutions such as the Gwangju Museum of Art in South Korea, Seto City Art Museum in Japan, Fire Works Ceramic Studio in Cardiff, the National Sculpture Factory in Ireland, as well as residencies in Berlin and Paris. She has participated in academic exchange programs with West Virginia University and Karlsruhe University of Arts and Design (HfG).
